What is a regional transportation plan?

Policy

Identifies the transportation goals, policies, and performance targets for Santa Cruz County.



Action

Lists projects and programs needed to operate, maintain and improve the transportation system in SC County.




Financial

Estimates the amount of funds that will likely be available for transportation projects over the 25-year RTP timeframe.





8. Future technology


Goal alignment



All constrained (likely funded) RTP projects, weighted by investment sum.

Hypothetically, if all the projects scored "high" for the goal, that goal's score would be 10.
